How can I help my child?

The transition from EYFS to KS1 is a big change for your child and we want to make it as easy as possible and provide a smooth transition for you and your child.

You can help to support to them by:

- Ensuring all your child's belongings are clearly labelled to avoid any lost uniform
- Encourage your child's growing independence by allowing them to come in each morning on their own and sort out their own belongings
- Listening to them read their home readers for a short period each night and ask them questions to clarify their understanding of what has been read
- Supporting them with their weekly spelling's homework
- Looking out for information about our topics on the website and encouraging your child to continue learning at home

if you have any concerns or worries matter how small. We are here to help





<u>Uniform and Equipment</u>

PE Kit: Blue shorts/joggers/leggings, white t shirt and pumps/trainers. Benedict Class will have PE on Tuesdays and Fridays this year. Please ensure all kit is clearly labelled with your child's name.

No jewellery is allowed at any time in school.

Your child's reading book should be in school every day. They will be given a book changing day when they will receive two new books if their reading diary has been signed to say they have finished their current books.

<u>Homework</u>

Please encourage and support your child with their homework. Each week, they will have a list of spellings to learn linked into their daily phonics sessions.

Children are also expected to read for 15 minutes each night. Books should be discussed and questions asked to develop comprehension skills.
