### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.

Find solutions to conflicts and rivalries. For example, accepting that not everyone can be Spider-Man in the game, and suggesting other ideas.

Select and use activities and resources, with help when needed. This helps them to achieve a goal they have chosen, or one which is suggested to them.

### Understanding the world

Talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice

Explore the natural world around them

Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside. Comment on images of familiar situations in the past Compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past

Begin to write words by segmenting the sounds in words
