How can I help my child?

Uniform and Equipment

Children should wear black school shoes—not trainers.

PE kit—Children should wear their PE Kit on their PE day. Our school PE Kit consists of navy-blue shorts/tracksuit bottoms, white Tshirt, and trainers.

Your child's PE days are **Monday and Friday**. Please ensure that your child has the correct kit and long hair is tied back.

No jewellery is allowed at any time.

Your child's reading book should be in school **<u>every</u>** <u>**day.**</u> They will be given a book changing day and receive two new books as long as their reading diary has been signed.

Homework

Please encourage and support your child with the following homework;

- Each week, they will have a list of **spellings** to learn, in addition to a specific **times table**. Your child has a brown book in their reading wallet which they can use to complete homework. They do not need to hand this book in each week, this is for your use only.
- Weekly spellings and times tables will be tested every Friday. Details, including which spellings and times tables to learn, can be found on our class web page/ on the homework sheet.
- Children are also expected to **read for 15 minutes** each night. Please support your child by asking comprehension questions to support their understanding.

In Year 4, there is a government statutory multiplication test towards the end of the academic year. The weekly times tables practice at home and school will really support your child to achieve their very best during the test. Please encourage your child to use **TTRockstars—Soundcheck** as this is in a similar format to the statutory test.



If your child is in **Year 4**, they will attend swimming lessons at All Seasons baths in Chorley. The Year 4 children in class will all go swimming on a Friday afternoon and return before the end of the school day. The first swimming session for all Year 4 children in Mary class is **Friday 8th September.** Please ensure they bring their swimming kit in each Friday.
