Welcome Back! - Welcome back to a new school year and as always if you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to get in touch with school. We would also like to take this opportunity to welcome all the new families to our community.

Celebration Assemblies – Every Friday we have a Celebration Assembly during which we award two children in each class certificates for 'Star of the Week' and one child 'Reader of the Week'. Parents and carers of these children are invited to attend and will get a message the day before, to let you know. The assembly starts at 9:00am in the KS2 hall, entry is through the side gates at the front of school.

The next reviews of Individual Education Plans and Learning Support Plans for SEND pupils are due to take place in the weeks either side of half term. If there is anything else you would like to clarify relating to SEND provision, please contact Mrs Hackett via the school office.

Uniform Reminders – The children look extremely smart as we begin a new school year and we thank parents and carers for supporting our uniform policy. Please remember that school shoes should be black, non-branded, suitable and durable enough for the children to be on the playground and the Daily Mile Track. Plain black socks should be worn by boys and plain white socks/navy tights for girls. School trousers/skirts/pinafores should be navy and <u>not</u> black or grey.

There are a number of children wearing earrings. Please can we remind families that we adhere to Lancashire County Council Health and Safety Policy and <u>do not allow any earrings</u>, as part of our school uniform policy. Children who have just had their ears pierced, or are worried about their ears healing up, should wear clear, rubber ear holders. School will not provide plasters to cover earrings.

Sacramental Programme – Children in Year 3 will be receiving information about enrolling on the Sacramental Programme, so that they can continue their faith journey and prepare to make their sacraments of Reconciliation (First Confession) and First Holy Communion during this academic year. Children in Years 4-6 who would like to make their sacraments should contact either the school office, the church office between 2:00 -5:00pm week days or Mrs Livesey 01772 336049, as soon as possible.

Children Collecting Younger Siblings EYFS Key Stage – Mr Ballard, as headteacher, has made the decision that no pre-school or reception aged child can be collected by a primary school aged child. If your child is in the EYFS Key Stage and you wish them to be collected by a child who is in Year 7 or older, you must give written consent to the school office for such an arrangement. Mr Ballard remains responsible for the welfare of children leaving our school grounds.
