Key Vocabulary:

Fieldwork	Practical work conducted by a researcher in the natural environment, rather than in a laboratory or office.
Map	A diagrammatic representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features, cities, roads, etc.
Route	A way or course taken in getting from a starting point to a destination.
Compass	An instrument containing a magnetized pointer which shows the direction of magnetic north and bearings from it.
Human features	Human features are things that have been built by people, such as houses, roads and bridges.
Physical features	Are naturally occurring features on planet Earth, such as, rivers, mountains and seas.
Man-Made	Made or caused by human beings.
