Personal, Social and Emotional Development

 Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs, e.g., brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing and drying their hands thoroughly.

Communication and Language

- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.
- Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... You sit there... I'llbe the driver."

Physical Development

- Skip, hop, stand on one leg and hold a pose for a game like musical statues
- Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes) and ball skills

Literacy

- Continue phase 1 phonics (Red Rose Scheme)
- Developing fine motor and mark making skills through continuous provision.
- Develop emergent writing through name writing practice.
- Continue development of letter recognition and formation..
